International Cultural Experience

10 LU / 3 US / 5 ECTS credits

If you are interested in British culture and society and how these factors contribute to a diverse range of experiences in the workplace, or you want to learn how recent political changes have affected Britain, then this is the summer school for you.

As well as lectures and seminars, you will have the chance to experience Lancaster life through activities related to business, culture, social issues, and political matters.

During the 3 weeks you will:

- Take part in community experiences;
- Engage in problem-solving team challenges where you'll consider the importance of language and communication, especially in intercultural contexts;
- Build international friendships on team-building social activities;
- Compete in the College Cup and have the opportunity to perform in a talent show;
- Take a trip to London and discover the diversity of British culture and differences between regions in England and urban/rural environments;
- You'll also have the opportunity to reflect on your experiences and present your work to your tutors and peers.

Environment and Sustainability

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

You will embark on a journey into our natural environment exploring a broad range of topics. Through a mixture of interactive lectures, practical laboratory sessions and field excursions, this course is perfectly designed to build your knowledge of our natural environment, and the human impacts on it – with a focus on innovations in sustainability.

You will be introduced to the culture, lifestyle and the environment of the UK and explore:

- Natural environments;
- Ecology;
- Hydrology/flooding/water treatment;
- Sustainability and circular economy;
- Soil/water/food security;
- Environmental pollution;
- GIS and Environmental Data Science.

You will also prepare assessment materials and work on a team project under the theme of 'Understanding, Respecting and Managing the Environment,' where you will develop a scientific approach to the study of environmental problems.

Film

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

Perhaps you are already studying film, or you may love films and want to develop your understanding of the composition of films and wider conventions of cinema. This programme provides practical sessions to evolve your knowledge and the chance to make a film.

Over 3 weeks you will:

- Analyse films - from close scrutiny of individual images and their interrelation with the soundtrack, through to the narrative assembly of shots and scenes;
- Develop short scripts – write a script and pitch it to your group to find out which one will be made;
- Work with cameras and edit – bring a script to life by producing a film that will be screened in a film finale at the end of the programme.

Global Media Studies

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

Why do we invest so much in media texts? Whether it's Taylor Swift, K-Pop, Pokémon, Harry Potter, or The Avengers, how do we experience being a media audience? And do we all experience media the same? Can media be used as a platform for social change?

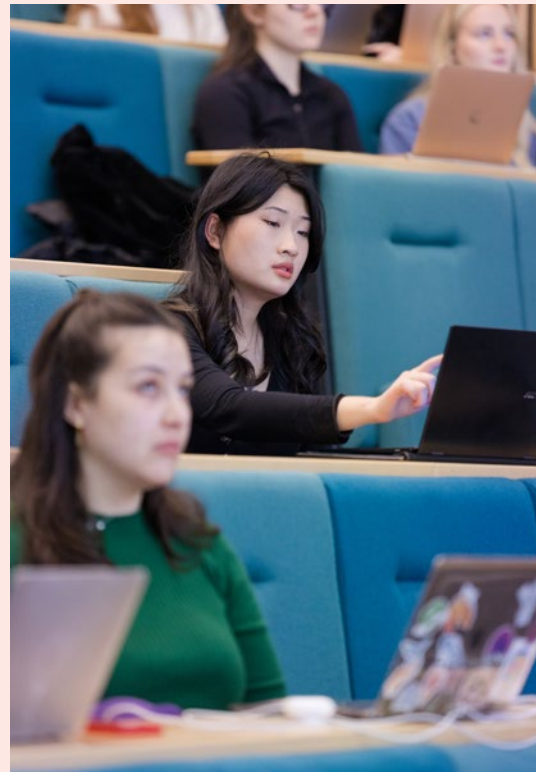
To address these questions, we will explore:

- Global media in our everyday lives;
- Differences and similarities between 'old' and 'new' media;
- Transcultural fandom in digital spaces;
- Social media campaigns and global social change;
- Representation and inequalities in issues of gender, race, class, sexuality and more.

Media shapes who we are, what we think and what we value. Digital technologies mean we have a globalised media landscape, and media touches almost every moment of our everyday lives. This summer school includes interactive lectures, multi-media workshops, and a trip to London. You will embark on a journey to explore the increasingly globalised media landscape, focusing on creativity, analytical thinking, and social change.

International Commercial Law

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

Are you studying law and would like to experience legal studies with both a basis in English law and legal methods, and a focus on international perspectives and issues? Explore current issues in international commercial law and develop your understanding and knowledge of the underpinning methods, processes, and concepts on this summer school.

You will learn about the formation and management of a business and explore the notion of insolvency and commercial transactions:

- Formation of business – you will be introduced to a brief history of commercial law and discuss various business vehicles as well as the concepts and implications of separate legal personality and limited liability;
- Management of business – you will discover key issues in the trading phase of a commercial enterprise. You will also consider the importance of finance/capital to commercial activities and how that finance is procured. You will discuss options for resolving international commercial disputes, with the focus on globally used measures of arbitration;
- Insolvency and commercial transactions – you will explore the notion of insolvency as a pervasive issue in international commercial law as well as the twin ideals of insolvency regimes. You will finish by considering the future of insolvency and other commercial law regimes in light of Brexit.

Introduction to Law

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

Have you always been interested in law matters, and are perhaps considering studying law at postgraduate level? This summer school will provide you with an opportunity to explore current legal issues and develop your awareness and understanding of the methods, processes and concepts that underpin university-level legal studies.

You will explore contemporary issues and themes concerning the role and impact of law in selected key areas:

- Criminal law;
- Human rights law;
- Civil law.

You will experience lectures, seminars and group work on campus to help you connect the issues and concepts to the practice and operation of law. Lectures will introduce the issues and concepts, explain their significance and the context in which they operate and develop. You will then have the opportunity to discuss and explore the issues further in seminars as well as develop your analytical and legal reasoning skills in master classes.

War and Diplomacy

15 LU / 4 US / 7.5 ECTS credits

Explore the role played by individual, state and other actors in war and diplomacy in the specific learning environment provided by Lancaster's Centre for War & Diplomacy (CWD). As well as class seminars and workshops, you will have the opportunity to test thinking with colleagues from across the world.

You will attend a series of deliberately wide-ranging opening sessions exploring the interwoven themes of war and diplomacy. Some of the topics you will delve into are:

- Consideration of ways of studying war and diplomacy; how does diplomacy fail, or wars succeed?
- Identity, religion, resources, and sectarianism;
- War as a subject of history;
- The emergence (and re-emergence) of the nation state, globalisation, international bodies/supranational diplomacy;
- Freedom and terror;
- The history of diplomacy and nuclear and environmental diplomacy;
- Failures of diplomacy;
- Conflicts in the contemporary arena and their witnessing and morality.



Socialise and explore

As well as academic content, you will have opportunities to make friends, try new skills and travel the UK with optional social activities in the evenings and weekends.

Weekend trips*

Explore the UK's natural landscapes, busy metropolitans, and historic towns. Visit places such as:

- Chester;
- Liverpool;
- London;
- Manchester;
- The Lake District;
- York.

*Please note that weekend trips can vary and are at an additional cost.

Evening socials

- Make friends over a game of badminton, frisbee or netball;
- Movie night;
- Sing your heart out at karaoke;
- Arts and crafts;
- Play strategy games.

Global Summer School fees consist of tuition and accommodation costs

The overall fee includes:

- Tuition;
- Catered ensuite single room on campus, or an approved off campus room*;
- Most meals**;
- Wide range of evening activities;
- 2-night trip to London.

* If you are staying away from Lancaster University as part of the scheduled programme, then the accommodation facilities will vary.

** Meals are not provided when away from campus on scheduled trips.

- You must be at least 18 years old at the start of the programme;
- Where applicable, you must meet pre-requisites for the chosen programme;
- You must be in good academic standing and on track to pass Year 1 of your university studies;
- If you come from a country where English is not an official language, you will need to provide proof of your language ability.

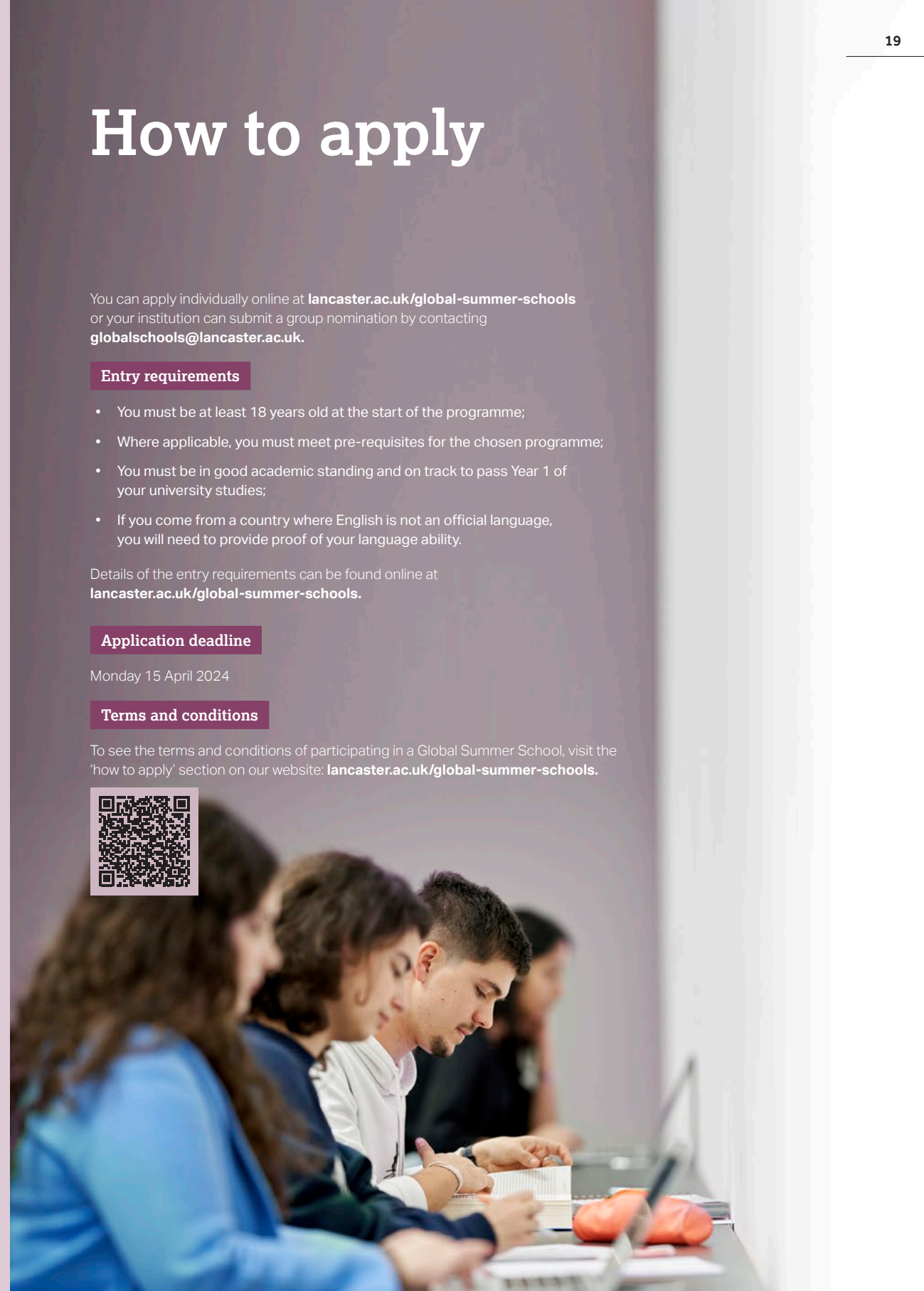
